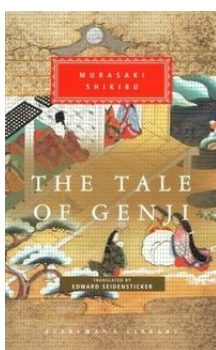


THE TALE OF GENJI
